

Finance

WAIS have completed the rationalisation of all of our accounts under our control and now only have to maintain a cheque account and a fixed term account.

Total fully audited funds to the end of September 2014 were prepared for our AGM indicating that we are financially sound.

Membership and Christmas Sundowner

In April a nominal annual membership fee of \$30 was issued to all of our members to effectively cover your membership through to 30th June 2015.

An encouraging response was received with approximately 120 Members becoming financial which will enable WAIS to be able to support its Members in the future without having to continue to draw down on our existing funds.

Curtin Expedition 2014 - Murchison District

WAIS was one of 15 sponsors providing support this year for the 2014 Biennial Curtin expedition to the Murchison District. We provided \$1,000 cash towards the cost of the venture, and administrative support for raising sponsorship and management of funds.

As you can see from the photos below this expedition was larger than usual, with up to 25 participants at one stage on camp, including some visitors.





The expedition departed Perth on June 28th to the Payne's Find/Cue/Mt Magnet area and returned on July 12th. All projects were field completed on time and included:

- Laser Scanning of the Payne's Find Gold Battery
- Laser Scanning of Jokers Tunnel gold mine
- Verifying the old existing 'Forrest Trig' geodetic network
- Re-establishing a junction of Vermin Proof fences
- Re-establishing cadastral boundaries scanning historic buildings at the old Big Bell town site
- Re-establishing cadastral boundaries and geodetic connections at the old Austin town site
- Scanning of Walga rock including a large section of Aboriginal rock-art













As usual students not only ran the individual projects, but project managed the whole trip supported by Industry Mentors, Curtin staff, and a cook (this time with a kitchen hand).

Project Management included daily logistics involving the 8 four wheel drive vehicles, trailers and survey and camping equipment. This year we had a full bush camp on Austin Downs Station for six nights introducing some additional challenges.

The expedition placed a commemorative sign at Austin Townsite opposite alongside Great Northern Highway showing cadastral details and historic information. GPS check points consisting of a plaque in concrete just above ground level showing latitude and longitude were placed at all significant points visited.



Two Curtin media students also accompanied the expedition, and they will produce a short documentary about the expedition later in the year which should be well worth seeing.

The expedition was rated as a great success by both students and mentors, and came in on budget, thanks to generous sponsorship from the Survey Industry. Thanks also go to the industry mentors who voluntarily provided their time and vehicles and in some cases fuel for the expedition.

WAIS is very proud to be able to support these expeditions. They provide valuable practical and technical experience for final year surveying students, and add to the overall standard of surveying education in WA.
